We all should be working on getting our current members active in our Chapters. Phone calls do wonders to let people know you're thinking of them.



## IN MEMORIAM PATRICIA (PAT) LÝNNE RASMUSSEN

It is with sadness we once again realize we've lost another link in the Golden Chain of Wisconsin Grand Chapter. Past Grand Matron, Sister Patricia (Pat) Lynne Rasmussen passed away June 28, 2021 at SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital – Madison at the age of 82. She was born in Flint, MI, on February 2, 1939, the eldest child of Howard and Marjorie Hawkins. Pat grew up in Flint and then studied dental hygiene at Northwestern University Dental School in Chicago. It was there in Chicago that she met the love of her life, Ronald R. Rasmussen, on a blind date. They were married on March 28, 1959.

She was also a member of the First Baptist Church of Janesville and the Order of the Eastern Star (OES) Phoenix Chapter, Beloit until they consolidated with Janesville Chapter. During her 30 years with the OES, Pat served this Grand Jurisdiction on many Committees, Grand Chaplain in 1994-1995, Grand Lecturer for "Precious Memories and Circle of Friendship" Grand Families also General Grand Chapter as Chairman of Benevolence and Grand Representative of Sao Paulo, Brazil.

Pat was Worthy Grand Matron in 1998-1999, serving with PGP Brother Ray Atkinson in the "Faith and Friendship" Session, during which she raised money for the OES Heart Fund. Their aim; In Faith and Friendship promote the ritualistic and charitable works of our Order, noting the we should all have the Faith to Believe.

The Watchwords were: Patience, Loving Kindness and Reverence-How appropriate, as she was a very patient caring person. Pat was a very soft-spoken person, but one always felt when she spoke, she would put a lot of thought into her words, doing it kindly yet with extending food for thought.

Her Bible verse: Be strong and of good courage, be not afraid for the Lord thy God is with thee. She exemplified this in her daily life-with her health issues, yet always a smile on her face and lending a kind, helping word to encourage others.

Appropriately her emblem was the Heart and Cross, yes to this cross she clung during some hard times.

The Long-Eared Bunny was her fun emblem noting we should take time to listen, which she certainly did. When we would express our dislike for the rabbits in our gardens or flowers and what we would like to do with them, she would say, "No, they are so cute, don't hurt them".

Pat enjoyed serving in her church and community. She worked for Dr. John Brewer, DDS for over 30 years. Enjoyment to her was watching Milwaukee Brewers' baseball games and getting lost in a good book.

But above all, Pat treasured her family. A devoted wife, mother, and grandmother, Pat demonstrated her love daily with her words, deeds, and time. She was actively involved in her family's lives and activities, spending many hours volunteering as a girl scout leader for her daughters, camping throughout Wisconsin, traveling with her family, and attending countless graduations and special events. She was also a talented cook and always made it a point to prepare her children's and grandchildren's favorite meals and desserts during visits. Her home was a happy place, and she made everyone feel safe, welcome, and important. Her shining life and love will continue to guide her family.

Pat is survived by her husband, Ronald R. Rasmussen, who served as Worthy Grand Patron in 2009; children, Katherine White, Cheryl (Randall) Riley, Ronald P. (Leann) Rasmussen, and Michael (Penny) Rasmussen; 11 grandchildren, 4 great-grandchildren, a sister, and sister-in-law.

Visitation will be Saturday, July 17, from 9:30 to 11 a.m. at First Baptist Church, 3414 Woodhall Drive, Janesville. OES services will be held at 11 a.m., and immediately thereafter, Rev. Tom DeWitt and Rev. Jerry Amstutz will officiate a memorial service. Memorials may be made to the Order of the Eastern Star Heart Fund. The Rasmussen family is being assisted by Henke-Clarson Funeral Home.
