Wrapping up the 2018-2021 Triennium

IN MEMORIUM

The Golden Chain of the Past Grands of Wisconsin has once again been broken with the passing of Past Grand Patron Brother William "Bill" Anderson who passed away on October 11, 2021, just 15 days after his 97th birthday. Brother Bill was born as a twin on September 26, 1924, in Chicago. He graduated from Lane Tech College Prep High School and then joined the US Army Air Corps in 1943 where he served as an aircraft mechanic. In 1944 he married Lavergne Luebbing and they were married for 70 years before her passing in 2014.

After the war, they moved to Three Lakes, Wisconsin, where he worked as a carpenter. A few years later he returned to Chicago for further training and then returned to Three Lakes where he opened Three Lakes TV & Radio Repair. During that time, he helped convert station WOBT—AM to an FM station. His technical skills led him to Congressman Alvin O'Konski who hired him as engineer at Channel 12 television in Rhinelander. In November 1968, a plane hit the guy wires of the broad-casting tower causing it to collapse and demolish the building. Bill was one of two people in the building at the time and escaped serious injury by diving into a corner.

Bill was a member of Eagle River Masonic Lodge and Eagle Chapter of Eagle River, Wisconsin. He was appointed Grand Sentinel in 1962 by Past Grand Matron Sister Belle West and Past Grand Patron Brother Harold Hardies. He went on to serve as Worthy Grand Patron with Sister Elaine Haas Simcox as his Worthy Grand Matron. Their session in 1965 was the Diamond Jubilee Session. In his acceptance address in 1964 he stated, "This is our 75th Diamond Jubilee year wherein our fraternity will celebrate 75 years of fellowship and love among its members in Wisconsin. This fine state can be very proud to have our 56,000 members who are ambassadors of good will, friendship, and brotherly love within its bosom. Like the diamond always highly valued, with its lustre always apparent, our fraternity should also be highly valued by us all."

In 1970 Bill and Lavergne moved to Florida where he worked as chief engineer at Channel 5 in West Palm Beach until his retirement in 1987. In 2003, they returned to Wisconsin and built a home in Sugar Bush where he lived until the time of his passing. In his retirement, Bill took up woodcarving, particularly birds and fish. His ducks, pheasants and grouse became so realistic that people often commented they thought his carvings were stuffed mounts.

Bill was preceded in death by his wife, Lavergne; son, Don; twin brother George and his parents. He is survived by his son Bill (Jackie) of Sugar Camp; daughter-in-law, Deanne Anderson; four grand-children and ten great-grandchildren. The sympathy of the Grand Chapter is lovingly extended to his family, to Eagle Chapter and to his many friends.

In token of sympathy and respect, let the charters of every Wisconsin subordinate chapter be draped for a period of 30 days and let this memorial be read at the next stated meeting of every chapter.
