

***In Memoriam
William Kelly, PGP***

Once again our Heavenly Father has summoned to His presence another member of our Golden Circle of Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons. Brother William F. "Bill" Kelly passed from his earthly home to that House Not Made With Hands on August 29, 2022. Bill was born March 23, 1930 in Portsmouth, Ohio. After graduating from Chillicothe (Ohio) High School, he attended Ohio University for two years, then joined the United States Navy where he served with the Seabees in the Philippine jungle and then Camp Zama, Japan. During his time in the service he met the love of his life, Beth Almen, and they were married in California on March 17, 1951.

After serving his country for four years, he returned to Ohio University and received his civil engineering degree in 1957. He went to work for Dupont in their construction division and was assigned to jobs in Virginia, New York and Texas after which he was transferred to Hamm, Germany, and then to Londonderry, Northern Ireland. In 1972, he took his retirement from that company and moved to Elcho, Wisconsin, and joined his father-in-law and partners at Builders Service. He was in charge of the engineering and surveying department and also spent 12 of those years as the Langlade County Surveyor. In 2002, he sold his shares in the company and he and Beth moved from Elcho to Antigo.

Always needing to be "doing something" Bill became involved in the community and spent many years as Antigo's Cheese Curd Wagon chairman. He also became the Langlade County Salvation Army Kettle Coordinator. The Salvation Army thrived and so did Brother Bill. He attended Faith United Church of Christ in Antigo and became very active with their food pantry. He drove to Wausau twice each week for many years to bring food from Wausau's Salvation Army to the food pantries in Antigo and also arranged for the consolidation of food pantries in Antigo.

He was a 62 year member of the Masons and served Crandon Lodge several times as Worshipful Master as well as serving Grand Lodge as an Area Administrator and District Deputy. He and Beth belonged to Jewel Chapter, OES, Antigo, where he served as Worthy Patron a number of times and was appointed Grand Sentinel by Past Grand Matron Sister Theda Andres and Past Grand Patron Brother Richard Clapper in 1990. He advanced to the office of Associate Grand Patron and was installed as Worthy Grand Patron of Wisconsin in 1992. He served in the East with Past Grand Matron Sister "Kittie" Slazas at their Christmas Dove session in Green Bay in 1993.

Bill was the recipient of the Rotary Foundation Paul Harris Fellow Award, Optimist Outstanding Service Award, Antigo First Volunteer Award, and in 2019 was named as a Wisconsin Hometown Hero. When Bill reached the point where he couldn't give anymore, he gave one last thing—his body to the University of Wisconsin for research.

Bill is survived by his wife of 71 years, Sister Beth, who was Grand Warder in 1986–1987; four children; a brother; nine grandchildren; five step-grandchildren; seven great grandchildren and four step great grandchildren. Services were held on September 8 at Faith United Church of Christ in Antigo. Rest well, thou good and faithful servant.

As a token of respect, this memorial is to be read at the first stated meeting after its receipt in every subordinate chapter and the charter draped for 30 days.



In Tribute to the Life of Helen J. Westmoreland
Past Most Worthy Grand Matron 2015 – 2018
Past Grand Matron of Florida 1996 – 1997

Saturday morning, August 13, 2022, heaven became a little brighter as our cheerful Hummingbird, Sister Helen J. Westmoreland (Gordon) entered her eternal home.

Helen's life began on April 3, 1936, in Munson, Florida to Mr. and Mrs. Dan Gordon. She was raised in rural Alabama and was the oldest of seven children. Living on a farm and helping to care for her siblings taught her many life lessons that over time made her the amazing woman she was. Helen's constant sense of responsibility, determination, honesty, and work ethics endeared her to every person she ever met.

Helen graduated from Red Level High School in 1953 and soon after met Victor Sloan Westmoreland of Charlotte, North Carolina on a blind date. He was her knight in shining armor in that Air Force uniform. The happy couple were married on October 15, 1954, in a simple ceremony and they shared 50 amazing years together. During the first few years of their marriage Victor was stationed in Bovington, England. Helen was filled with excitement and our little farm girl joined him on their adventure of a lifetime.

The highlight of their lives was the birth of their daughter Karen in 1964. This little bundle of joy brought a special kind of love with exciting new hopes and dreams for their future.

Helen began her thirty-five-year civil service career as a telephone operator on Eglin AFB and due to her loyalty, dedication, and good work ethics, she was highly recognized and achieved several promotions and awards. At the time of her retirement, Helen was serving as comptroller for the Eglin Finance Office. It was difficult for her to say goodbye to those for whom she had so much respect and admiration. She continued to praise the military, first responders, and all who served our country.

Being diagnosed with cancer in 1967, our Hummingbird did not let it slow her down one bit and was proud and thankful to be a "cancer survivor". Being a member of numerous organizations such as Daughters of the Nile, Order of the Amaranth, ABWA, Beta Sigma Phi sorority, and of course her beloved Eastern Star, Helen was obviously a "people person". Just like a Hummingbird, she did not sit still for long and was up flitting around the room talking with friends and introducing herself to strangers no matter where she was. She would start by introducing herself, then asking where they were from, about their families and asking if they were Military, Masons or Eastern Star. Her favorite pastime was reading, and she spent every free moment she had reading her many books.

Helen was initiated into the Order of the Eastern Star in 1968, in Niceville Chapter No. 254 and held several positions in her chapter prior to becoming Worthy Matron in 1972, serving with Brother Charles Cooper, Worthy Patron. Her Eastern Star journey did not end there. She was a "rising star", as one of her good friends commented. Helen served as Grand Marshal in the 1981-1982 "Seasons of Love" Grand Family, Anita Atkins, Worthy Grand Matron and Dr. Alfred Massam, Worthy Grand Patron. Helen was elected and served as Associate Grand Conductress in 1993 - 1994, Grand Conductress in 1994 - 1995, and Associate Grand Matron

1995 -1996. Then our vivacious Hummingbird was elected and served as Worthy Grand Matron in 1996-1997 with Brother Robert D. Fiedler, Worthy Grand Patron, and the "Precious Memories" Grand Family in the Ninety-Second Annual Session of the Grand Chapter of Florida. Her outgoing personality continued to gain her recognition, and later that year Helen received an appointment to the General Grand Chapter Mental Health and Mental Retardation Committee. Her ambition and dedication to Eastern Star brought new challenges and excitement for Helen and the Grand Chapter of Florida when she was elected Right Worthy Grand Trustee in 2000- 2006. At the 2006 Triennium, Helen was elected and served as Right Worthy Associate Grand Conductress from 2006 - 2009, Right Worthy Grand Conductress in 2009-2012, Right Worthy Associate Grand Matron in 2012-2015. Our Hummingbird followed her dream and was elected and Installed Most Worthy Grand Matron, serving with her good friend Robert C. Penoyer, Most Worthy Grand Patron along with their General Grand Family, affectionately called the "Flock" in the 2015-2018 Triennium. The Forty – Ninth Triennial Assembly "Precious Memories on the Wings of Love" was held in Orlando, Florida, October 25 – November 2, 2018, with sisters and brothers from around the world attending.

As Most Worthy Grand Matron, Sister Helen chose Regenerative Medicine as her special charity, hoping the world would be a safer and better place with this modern technology. Yes, Helen had big dreams and high hopes, but she also felt the future of medicine would be in Regenerative Medicine. She continued to promote recognition and support of all First Responders around the world in addition to numerous other charities.

One of Helen's favorite song was "The Wind Beneath My Wings" because it made her feel that her loving husband, Vic, her precious daughter Karen, her amazing grandchildren, Jamie and Austin and her great- grandsons were with her, and always in her heart as she traveled the world. When she was home, Helen made frequent trips to Georgia so she could attend birthdays, Holidays, and sporting events with Karen and the grandchildren. As soon as she returned home to Florida, she would stop in to visit friends, and over a few cups of coffee, share stories about what Karen and the children were up to and how proud she was of her family. While at home, Helen loved attending her church, Crosspoint Methodist Church in Niceville, and rarely missed a Sunday School class with Mr. John Macon.

We extend our deepest sympathy and love to her daughter, Karen Madruga; her grandchildren, Jamie Topliff (Josh) and Austin Madruga (Abbye); her great-grandchildren, James, Benjamin, and Peter Topliff; her sisters, Faye Dean and Peggy Peabody; her brothers-in-law Robert Westmoreland, James Westmoreland, and Don Kearns; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.
