International Headquarters Committee



The latest update on what the International Headquarters Committee has assisted in. July 2022 solar film was purchased and installed on windows on the 2nd and 4th floors for \$17,000 thanks to the attention and generosity of the Grand Chapter of Pennsylvania. We also assisted with another project in February 2023, the skylight over the staircase had rotted seals. We provided half of this cost. Rain was coming in while the heat was going out. The solar film has lowered the heating and air conditioning costs and repair of the skylight has reduced that even more. A third project happened in January 2023. The committee was asked to assist with the cost of refinishing the wooden floors on the second floor. We gave the additional \$13,000 needed, by going to a matte finish, cleaning was reduced by two complete steps. Therefore, there would be a reduction in the amount of money spent on cleaning supplies and the hours it takes to clean each week; sometimes twice and occasionally three (3) times.

As of March 2023, the IHQ project has received \$65,872.74 in donations.

Items we as a Grand Chapter can assist in is donating monies to help in renovations of the furniture (upholstering, caning) as they are need of repair and each chair cost a minimum of \$800 and up. They are doing a donation listing if a chair is done, that it notes which jurisdiction donated to do that item.

Every dollar counts in helping our house, which is the International Headquarters, in Washington DC. We also have the "Our House" pin for sale for \$5.00 which benefits our efforts to raise funds for these renovation projects. I will have them at Grand Chapter if you have not purchased one yet.

Older Americans Month

was established in 1963 when at the time, there were only 17 million living Americans that had reached their 65th birthday. Around a third of older Americans lived in poverty, and programs to meet their needs were not many. For that reason, there was a growth of interest in older Americans and their concerns. In April 1963, a meeting was held between President John F. Kennedy and members of the National Council of Senior Citizens (N.C.S.C.), leading to the designation of May as Senior Citizens Month, now Older Americans Month.

At first, Older Americans Month was observed as an appreciation of past and present older Americans for their contributions to the country, especially those who defended the country. Since then, every president has been issuing a formal proclamation during or before May, requesting all citizens to pay tribute to older Americans in their communities. Since 1978, according to Administration for Community Living (A.C.L.), Older Americans Month has been observed with a different theme each year. This year, the theme is Aging Unbound, the <u>A.C.L.</u> defines Aging Unbound as "an opportunity to explore diverse aging experiences and discuss how communities can combat stereotypes."

In 2019, the theme was Connect, Create, Contribute — as an encouragement for older Americans to connect with family, friends, and services. In 2020, it was Make Your Mark, in which individuals were encouraged to celebrate countless contributions that older adults make to our communities. The 2021 theme was Communities of Strength, celebrating the stories and contributions of older Americans that helped support and inspire others. And in 2022, the theme for Older Americans Month was Age My Way. It focused on how older Americans can plan to stay in their homes and live independently in their communities.

Want to celebrate the older Americans in your life? Here are some easy ideas that go a long way and make our older Americans feel special!

- Deliver flowers
- Support a breakfast or luncheon
- Recognize their accomplishments and/or their service to our country
- Initiate a conversation, thank them for their contributions to the community, their church, their neighborhood
- Host a game night
- Encourage them to share their stores in writing, table conversation, or open forum
