
There is interest in working on a project for Grand Chapter. I would be interested in working with this group. There was no consensus about what this group would like to be called.

It was great to be able to differentiate symptoms that may be different for women. As caretakers, women tend to disregard symptoms and may not seek care in an appropriate time frame. We were assured that healthcare providers would not consider us silly to request to be seen.







Report from our Exemplifications:

Our first event was hosted by Lemonweir Chapter (Tomah) on June 22, 2024. All Grand Officers were present except for the Associate Grand Conductress (Holly Swenson PT- LaBelle), and Ruth (Mary Moen-PT) Sparta, Viroqua). Both were given Honorary memberships to the Trust in the Lord Grand Family. We exemplified the floor work and Red Book instructions for an Official Visit. Grand Electa gave her lecture. Our protem Ruth demonstrated what would be done in case of a protem. Business included reports about our joint WGM/WGP project, membership, proficiency, and the schedule for Conductress classes.

We had a fantastic picnic lunch. After the work of the day, we had a memorial for our first WGM Adency Irons given by the WGM, and a beautiful memorial for PGM Helen Wheeler provided by the Western Stars area club. A travel award was presented to Christine Sericati who traveled from Iron Mountain chapter in Menomonee, Michigan. The sunshine total was \$126. This was collected for the joint WGM/WGP project.

The event was well attended with the following chapters having the most members present- Sparta (8), Lemonweir (7), Ruth (6), Viroqua (5) and Wautoma (4). We had twenty-one chapters represented including one in Michigan. There were eighty-two members listed on the sign in sheets, consisting of GGCC members (2), PGMs (6), PGP (1), Grand Officers (17), Worthy Matrons (10), Worthy Patrons (2), District Deputies (2), Grand Representatives (5) and members (37).

Our second Exemplification was held July 13, 2024, and was hosted by Janesville Chapter. We used the same meeting format. Gail O-Connell (Ozaukee, Loyalty, and Fond du Lac) was our protem Ruth. Janine Coley (LaBelle) was our protem Warder. Both were given honorary memberships. Sister Esther did her lecture. Sister Ruth provided an example of the protem requirements for initiation.

We had a fabulous lunch provided by the chapter. Our sunshine total was \$111. Oregon had the most members present. Sisters Debi Ahrens and Joan Lillie (Northwest Chapter) traveled the farthest. We did have other travelers (PGM Marty Swanson and her husband Bruce) who were visiting from Florida via Lake Geneva.

Bridget Briski (Martha) was appointed Grand Representative of Colorado in Wisconsin. Twenty-four chapters plus one Michigan chapter were represented. Fifty-one members were signed in including GGCC members (3), PGMs (7), Grand Officers (17), WMs (3), WP (1), District Deputies (2), Grand Representatives (2) and members (16).

Our final Exemplification was held July 27, 2024, at Wauwatosa Chapter (Brookfield). It was a bee-utiful day. We followed the same business format. Our protems for the day were Chaplain (Holly Swenson- LaBelle), Adah (Gail O'Connell- Ozaukee, Fond du Lac, Loyalty), and Ruth (PGM Carole Biddick- Trillium). These members were given honorary memberships. Our sunshine totaled \$105

The travel award was given to PGM Vickie Wallner who traveled from Davenport, Iowa to be with us. Sister Connie Skarvan (Honor) was a close second. The presidents of Triwaukee and Southeastern Area Clubs (Gail O'Connell and Jan Winget) presented GGCM Mary Barnet a check for \$1900 for the service dog project. PGM Tammy Hundhausen was given a check for \$1900 for the Youth Scholarship fund. These monies represented proceeds from this year's wine and cheese pairing.

The Appointed 10 provided a skit for our Grand Lecturer, PGM Mary Barnett. She received several beautiful peacocks to add to her collection. Twenty-one chapters were represented in addition to one each in Michigan and Iowa. Attendance was around fifty members, including GGCCM (2), PGMs (5), PGP (1), Grand Officers (16), Grand Representatives (3), District Deputies (3), WMs (5), WPs (2). We appreciate all who took the time to attend Exemplifications this year. We hope the format provided information clarifies what is expected at this year's Official Visits.

Formation of a New Committee:

Per the request of a motion passed at Grand Chapter, I have assembled a committee to evaluate our needs on scheduling future Grand Chapter sessions after our current contract expires.

I have asked PGM Brenda Gaulke to chair. The other members are PGP Craig Wepprecht, PGMs Bobbi Jo Clark, Rosie Fiscus, Terri Hundhausen, and Sister Marianne Totsch. I have asked the group to consider the following:

- 1. Should we meet at a different time of year?
- 2. Should we meet on different days of the week?
- 3. Should the session length be changed?
- 4. Is our current location still central?
- 5. If we keep our current venue, are they able to provide the services/amenities we think we need?
- 6. What can/should be done to encourage attendance by our members?
- 7. What can/should be done to encourage attendance by guests from other jurisdictions?
- 8. What can/should be done to encourage attendance by our affiliated Masonic organizations?
- 9. How can we increase the number and variety of vendors?
- 10. How will any proposed changes affect our by-laws and fiscal year?

I would also like this group to develop a template to use when considering alternative sites. I would ask that we consider accessibility for members with mobility challenges not only for Grand Chapter, but for any state event. We should also identify the services we need at our events. The use of a sound system is one of many services we ask for at our venues.

If you have information, you feel would help this group in their work, please contact PGM Brenda Gaulke. This group will present a report of their findings at our Grand Chapter session in May of 2025.

<u>Automated external defibrillators</u> can save lives during sudden cardiac arrest. This is a quick step-by-step guide that you can print up to review the AED steps and keep them fresh in your memory.

How to Use An AED

These AED steps should be used when caring for a non-breathing child aged eight or older who weighs more than fifty-five pounds, or an adult.

After checking the scene and ensuring that the person needs help, you should ask a bystander to call 911 for help.

- 1 Complete the CHECK and CALL steps
- 2 As soon as an AED is available, turn it on and follow the voice prompts
- **3** Remove clothing and attach pads correctly
 - Remove all clothing covering the chest. If necessary, wipe the chest dry
 - Place one pad on the upper right side of the chest
 - Place the other pad on the lower left side of the chest, a few inches below the left armpit

Note: If the pads may touch, place one pad in the middle of the chest and the other pad on the back, between the shoulder blades

- 4 Plug the pad connector cable into the AED, if necessary
- **5** Prepare to let the AED analyze the heart's rhythm
 - Make sure no one is touching the person
 - Say, "CLEAR!" in a loud, commanding voice
- 6 Deliver a shock, if the AED determines one is needed
 - Make sure no one is touching the person
 - Say, "CLEAR!" in a loud, commanding voice
 - Push the "shock" button to deliver the shock
- 7 After the AED delivers the shock, or if no shock is advised, immediately start CPR, beginning with compressions





Know the warning signs of heart attack and stroke

You could save your life



Heart attack and stroke are life-or-death emergencies — every second counts. If you think you or someone you're with has any symptoms of heart attack or stroke, call 911 immediately.

For a stroke, also note the time when the first symptom(s) appeared. A clot-busting drug received within 3 to 4.5 hours of the start of symptoms may improve your chances of getting better faster.



Heart Attack Warning Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most of them start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. The warning signs are:



 Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.



 Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.
 Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.



 Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.



 Shortness of breath. This may occur with or without chest discomfort.

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting and back or jaw pain.



Stroke Warning Signs

- Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden confusion, or trouble speaking or understanding

- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness or loss of balance or coordination
- · Sudden, severe headache with no known cause

The acronym F.A.S.T. is an easy way to recognize and respond to the sudden warning signs of stroke. The letters stand for:



 Face dropping — Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop or is it numb?



 Arm weakness — Ask the person to raise both arms. Is one arm weak or numb? Does one arm drift downward?



Speech difficulty — Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence such as, "The sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly? Are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand?



 Time to call 911 — If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911 and get them to the hospital immediately.
